Russell Moore Beloved Father and Devoted Husband

Russ passed away on Dec. 23, 2020, in Valencia, Calif., after a two week battle with COVID -19. All the staff at Henry Mayo Newhall Hospital said what a neat man he was, and were there to comfort him.

Russ was born Dec. 6, 1927, in Keokuk, Iowa. He left the snowy midwest in the mid-1940s to come to sunny Southern California. He married Betty Crocker Moore in 1952, and after 68 years, was just recently widowed this past June. The family settled in Thousand Oaks in 1962, and he lived there until health issues forced a move in 2016. For the last five years, Russ was a very active member of the Atria of Santa Clarita community, even calling Bingo many days a week.

Russ worked for the Southern California Gas Co. for 37 years. He was an avid golfer all of his life, just quitting the game at 87. It was not until he was 81 when he scored his first hole in one at the Westlake Golf Course. A year later at 82, he scored his second, on the same 17th hole.

For over 40 years, Russ and Betty were active members of the square dance community, dancing and traveling throughout the U.S. with the Buckles and Bows group.

Family vacations were enjoyed for decades in Maui. The California Redwoods were also a favorite spot. Russ also enjoyed watching the old Westerns.

Russ is survived by his daughter, Marilyn Moore of Santa Clarita; and his son, Randall Moore of Yuba City, Calif.

Russ was a wonderful successful husband and father, and will be greatly missed. Dad lives forever in our hearts and souls.



Our Story— Steve and Melody Buczynski

It's a small World. Steve and Melody both lived their early childhood years about 15 miles east of San Diego in the small town of Spring Valley California. Although they didn't know it at the time Steve would pass Melody's grandparent's house every day on his way home. They first met many years later at the wedding of Steve's older brother Leon to Melody's older sister Jean. They would see each other from time to time during family events but there was no romance.



Steve graduated high school in 1972 and joined the Air Force. Melody's family moved to AZUSA California in 1966 where she grew up. Steve was stationed at Norton Air Force base in San Bernardino. After Steve's dad passed away his mother moved to Arcadia California to be closer to family. (ROMANCE BEGINS May 1974) On one of Steve's trips to Arcadia he stopped by AZUSA. Melody was home sick that day from school with a cold. For some reason when Steve arrived, Melody was feeling much better so they both went to see the school concert that evening. Not sure how it happened but Steve came down with a cold shortly thereafter. The romance blossomed and August 1975 the beginning of Melody's senior year in high school they were engaged. One year later after Steve's discharge from the Air Force and Melody's graduation they were married September 1976. (They said it would never last).

Steve joined the Air Force Reserves and got a civilian job at March AFB as an aircraft mechanic. They bought their first house in Sunnymead California (Marino Valley today). They were blessed with a daughter Christina in January 1979. They lived so close to the base Steve would go home for lunch from time to time. 9 months later they were blessed with their son Sean in October 1982.

They moved to Santa Maria California in May 1983 when Steve got a quality assurance job at Vandenberg AFB on the space shuttle and satellite programs. Looking for career advancement they moved to Thousand Oaks when Steve landed a job with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) in September 1990. Melody started working at a school kitchen with mother's hours for 21 years. Like most parents their lives revolved around the kid's activities for a number of years, scouting, sports and school activities. They are very proud of both kids receiving the highest scouting ranks, Girl Scout Gold award and Boy Scout Eagle award. On a side note, Sean is currently working as a first responder for the City of Santa Maria Fire Department. The kids have blessed Steve and Melody with 5 grandchildren and still counting ranging 4 to 18 years old.

Steve retired from the FAA in December 2010. Melody retired from the Conejo Valley school district food services in June 2011. They currently enjoy Cruising and traveling the world. Like everyone, Covid 19 has put a major dampener on checking off items on their bucket list. On the positive side they are in good health and spirits high.

Like most people becoming empty nesters they needed something to do. One day after church, they were having dinner out and ran into good friends, Pat and Jerry Akers. They were invited to a beginning square dance class. The rest is history, 12 years later they can't wait for their vaccination to get back to their favorite social activity, Square Dancing.
