#### — Our Story— Ted and Joanne Noller



Both Ted and Joanne were born and raised in Southern California. Ted's school days were in the Highland Park area of Los Angeles. He graduated from LAPC (Los Angeles Pacific College) which has since merged with Azusa College to become Azusa Pacific University . After college he taught one year of elementary school before going to Fuller Seminary, graduating in 1966. Shortly after graduating from Fuller he went looking for possible wife material at Hollywood Presbyterian Young Adults where Joanne was an active member. This was a thriving Christian singles group producing many marriages. Joanne went to North Hollywood High School and graduated from UCSB in 1963 with a life time teaching credential. (they no longer give these) The entire summer between college graduation and starting to teach she traveled in Europe, the Middle East, and Mediterranean with a Christian study group. She taught second grade in Glendale for 6 years. Ted and Joanne were married in 1967 and moved to Thousand Oaks in November 1969 awaiting the arrival of their first daughter. Their second daughter was born in 1972. Ted worked with the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association for 23 years. He traveled the United States organizing theater showings in communities with Christian films like The Restless Ones, The Hiding Place and Joni and the last 10 years headed up the program. Joanne loved being a stay at home Mom, especially since Ted traveled up to 20 days out of the month. After 17 years she began to think about going back to teach. A providential meeting with the principal of Bethany Christian School resulted in Joanne teaching third grade for 12 years and then serving on the school board after retiring.

In Ted's late 30's he started running and later joined the Conejo Track Club, of which he is still a member. This group remains socially active even if most of the old folks don't run any more but try to stay active by walking and other activities. Ted took up skiing late in life and still loves it in spite of a recent accident. Before Ted retired he sold Cadillac and Oldsmobile here in T.O., also being the first to sell a Hummer in Southern California.

Joanne used to play tennis, but can't overhead serve any more, so pickle ball is more her speed with a smaller court and lighter paddle. After retiring she greatly enjoyed for many years helping her daughter home school the 3 grandsons, the oldest of which just got married March 28. Another area of deep satisfaction for her is studying the Bible with the CBS (Community Bible Study) program. She also was recently made very happy because Curves has reopened so she can exercise with other women.

We joined Buckles and Bows in 2004 after John Duhig dragged us with him, picking us up to make sure we didn't miss. Ted didn't think he would like it, but seems he did.
